## **Anti-Bullying Week**





On Monday it is the start of national Anti-Bullying week and this year's theme is 'All Different, All Equal.' We will be starting the week with a special school day, where the children will work with their school families on activities that explore individual differences and equalities. Reported incidents are dealt with seriously and records are kept to ensure the situation is monitored carefully in the future. The teachers also talk regularly to the children about the importance of treating everyone equally and fairly.
