People's Book Prize Winner Visits School



The award-winning, bestselling children's author, Billy Bob Buttons, will be visiting this school on the AFTERNOON of Tuesday 30th January

He is the author of sixteen very popular children's books including Felicity Brady and the Wizard's Bookshop, the bestselling Muffin Monster, Tiffany Sparrow Spook Slayer, The Cool Kids Book Prize winner, WIDE AWAKE, and the UK People's Book Prize winner and bestseller, I think I Murdered Miss. Last year, this book sold over 100,000 in the UK alone and won the 2014 UK People's Book Prize.

There will also be an opportunity for your child to meet Mr. Buttons and buy a signed and dedicated book. A letter will be sent home nearer the time with more information.

Attached to this letter will be a price list plus lots of information on the different books they can pick from. If you wish your child to buy a signed book (and you will not be with your child), simply put the money (the author will have change with him) in an envelope (with your child's name and class written on the front) and hand it to the class teacher on the day. Book prices range from £6.95 to £9.95.

Mr. Buttons will be doing the book signing at the end of the school day. So, if parents wish to meet him and help their child pick a book, they can do so then.
